Robert Holmin Ljud&Bild is proud to present its 10<sup>th</sup> recording, **Hours Well Spent** (RHLB10), a CD presenting 79 minutes of keyboard music performed by Anna Maria McElwain on the clavichord.

The first recording of Anna Maria McElwain contains a wide selection of keyboard music beginning with the Ricercare of Andrea Gabrieli from the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> century and concluding with a Ligeti Capriccio from 1947. The title of the CD refers to the many hours the composers spent in making this music, as well as the time Anna Maria spent in mastering the difficulties of the repertoire on the CD, such as music of Bach and Saint-Saëns. It is of special interest to hear music which was not originally composed for the clavichord, such as Beethoven and Chopin.

The clavichord on this recording was built in 1808 by Pehr Lindholm and Söderström of Stockholm. It belongs to the Nydahl collection (Stiftelsen Musikkulturens Främjande, Stockholm) and has miraculously been preserved up to this day. It is a rather unique instrument with a wonderful sound.

Currently Anna Maria McElwain performs internationally on historical keyboards and is one of the founders and artistic directors of The Nordic Historical Keyboard Festival.
